



THE MATER ECCLESIAE ABBEY IS AN ENCLOSED FEMININE BENEDICTINE ABBEY LOCATED IN SAN GIULIO ISLAND, ON THE LAKE OF ORTA. ORIGINALLY, ONLY SIX NUNS USED TO LIVE HERE AFTER MOVING FROM VIBOLDONE ABBEY IN 1973. Their prioress is Anna Maria Canopi, author of several books ON CHRISTIAN AND MONASTIC SPIRITUALITY AND WIDELY CONSIDERED AS THE MOST PROMINENT LIVING FEMALE FIGURE IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. AT PRESENT, OVER SEVENTY NUNS LIVE IN THE ABBEY, THIS PROVING BOTH THE VITALITY OF THE ORDER AND THE STRENGTH OF AN EXTREME CHOICE OF LIVING, WHICH MIGHT APPARENTLY SEEM OFFBEAT WITH THE LACK OF VOCATION WITHIN THE CLERGY. ALL THE NUNS IN THE ABBEY HAVE A VERY HIGH LEVEL OF CULTURE AND THEIR PRIORITY IS TO KEEP ALIVE THE TRADITION OF GUGLIELMO DA VOLPIANO, WHO WAS BORN IN SAN GIULIO ISLAND IN 962 A.D. AND WHO STRONGLY CONTRIBUTED TO THE SPREAD OF MONASTICISM THROUGHOUT EUROPE. IN THE ABBEY, THE NUNS CARRY OUT RESEARCH ON ANCIENT MANUSCRIPTS AND THEY TRANSLATE THEM FROM VULGAR AND LATIN TO ITALIAN. BUT RESTAURATION OF ANCIENT TEXTILES (TAPESTRIES, VESTMENTS AND FURNITURE) IS THEIR FORTE: PROFESSIONALISM, COMMITMENT AND RESEARCH IS THEIR HALLMARK.
